Position Overview:

The California Northstate University College of Health Science (CNUCHS) is continually seeking excellent teaching faculty for part-time instruction.

Job Classification: Part-time

Review of Applications: Applications are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Generally, Spring semester applicant review begins by November 1st Summer term review begins February 1st and Fall semester applicant review begins by April 1st.

Anticipated Start Date: Spring semester start date will be January 7th; Summer term start date will be June 1st, Fall semester start date will be August 1st.

Reporting Responsibility: Reports directly to the Senior Associate Dean of Academic Affairs.

Education and Experience: A master's degree in the subject area is the minimum requirement, although a doctorate is often preferred (ABD's also considered). Teaching experience in the subject area is highly desired and may be required. Experience with education technology, such as learning management software (Canvas, Blackboard, etc.) is preferred. Salary is dependent upon qualifications and relevant experience. Official Transcripts may be required upon hire.

Job Description: Part-time faculty are expected to maintain the highest standard of classroom teaching excellence, adhere to college policy, and hold regular office hours for student assistance. Part time faculty may also be asked to attend regular meetings with course lead faculty to maintain alignment with institutional and course learning outcomes.
